Arch 405 Fall 2008 - OBrien Project 1 Storyteller's Hut Issued: 25 August 2008

Brief:

"Storytelling is the ancient art of conveying events in words, images, and sounds often by improvisation or embellishment. Stories or narratives have been shared in every culture and in every land as a means of entertainment, education, preservation of culture and in order to instill moral values." (source: Wikipedia)

This project proposes a small living space for a resident story-teller. The story-tellers are people who will live onsite during the schoolyear for about a month at a time, with a new story-teller arriving onsite every 30 days.

The story-tellers will come to College Station from the far corners of Texas, telling stories of the history and culture of the people in their home region to students in the third, fourth, and fifth grades of the College Station - Bryan School districts.

While the "American Shelter" at Veterans Park in College Station provides excellent restroom and covered picnic facilities for large groups. Due to its size, material choices and geometry it has proven to be a difficult acoustical environment for the spoken word.

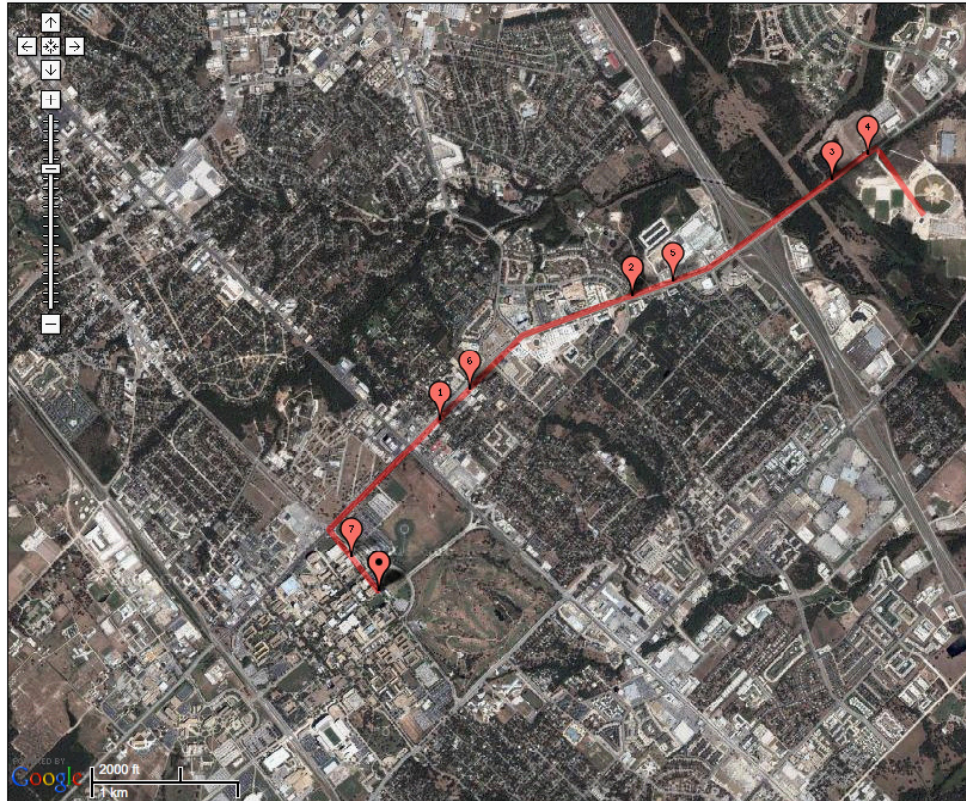
Your commission is to design a small residence for the story-teller to live, cook, and sleep in during their month stay, and to design an attached, rain-protected, shaded space capable of seating up to 30 elementary school students. Students will arrive by bus and be dropped off at the shelter with their teachers, then will walk to the story-teller's hut for the program, have a boxed lunch at the shelter, then ride the bus back to school.

Your designs for the story-tellers hut and student space must meet guidelines for the Americans with Disabilities Act. The hut itself will be "off-the-grid" in terms of electricity and gas, so must provide an alternative means of making and storing electricity and providing for heating and cooling of the spaces.
